Two Imagine Grants were present by ZEF in 2005. Mary Mills, Union Elementary, received a grant for her project "On the Iditarod Trail." This grant allowed Mary to experience the famous Iditarod Trail Dog Sled Race, which she has been incorporating into her curriculum for many years.

Upon returning from the race Mary shared, "I cannot begin to adequately thank you for enabling me to experience this incredible week. I just returned today, and I have memories (and 190 photos!) to last a lifetime. I called my hus-

band from the ceremonial start in Anchorage to try to explain my excitement about being there, and I just burst into tears!"

Deb Hall, Eagle Elementary, received a grant for her project, "Schools Attuned," which will send Deb to training for the Schools Attuned program in June 2006. The Schools Attuned program "provides parents, educators and students with a 'roadmap' of the student's abilities in the areas of memory, attention, motor skills, social skills, organization, problem solving and perception, as well as reading skills," Deb stated in her grant request.
